Things parents should consider before signing the waiver form:

June 14 is the deadline for students to change their course requests.

- 10th , 11th, 12th graders must stay in the class until the end of the first semester.
 - 9th graders may drop one of their waived courses.
 - If the lower level class is full, then your student will not be able to change to a different class.
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Things parents should consider before signing the waiver form:

Your child's GPA could be affected because the work is harder in the upper level class. .

- Your child's teachers know his/her abilities and work habits.
 - Your child's work habits will most likely be the same from this year to the next.
 - Advanced level courses are more work. Please weigh your child's extracurricular activities v. the extra load an advanced course level requires.
 - Pre-AP is a big jump from on-level in any subject area.
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Reminders about Honors, Pre-AP and AP classes:

- No retesting is allowed for failed tests
 - Receive extra points for GPA only if semester average is above 75
 - Can remain UIL eligible with a grade of 60-69 but 70 is the lowest passing grade
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Filling out the waiver form:

- Fill in the information at the top of the waiver form
 - Print your child's full name – if you don't know the ID number leave it blank
 - List the course you want to drop and the course you want to waive into
 - Consult the cheat sheet to provide the correct course number
 - Initial that you understand the process for dropping a waived course
 - Sign the form – it's final on June 14.
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
